Per the WWIDA document it is already a struggle to maintain a specialty physician practice in this region. In addition, the physicians are required to sign personal guarantees for tenant leases and loans making this a risky decision for each partner without the financial assistance.

If the Applicant is unable to obtain Financial Assistance for the Project, what will be the impact on the Applicant and County/City/Town/Village?

Without the new technology, access to quality care may be limited and/or residents would need to travel to other New York counties to receive diagnostic testing of the same technology. The longest distances for patients to travel in Warren county is 56 miles and Washington county is 63 miles, approximately, based on the northern ends of the counties to Saratoga County.

Without the ability to recruit and retain radiologists, the practice could eventually dissolve. This was the case with the example of Women's Health OB/GYN practice closing their doors in Glens Falls and Saratoga Springs in August 2023.

Project: Building Expansion for New Medical Imaging Technology

Project Location: Adirondack Radiology North Country 170 Carey Road Queensbury, NY 12804

Request Reasons for Financial Assistance:

- Challenging healthcare environment:
 - The 2024 Medicare Physician Fee Schedule decreased payments on average by 1.77% for Radiology services. This is upon previous years of continuous decreases especially for Radiologist Physician Practices billing.
 - Example: Source Diagnostic Radiology Journal September October 2022 article "Declining Medicare Reimbursement for Diagnostic Radiology: A 10-Year Analysis Across 50 Imaging Studies".
 - Conclusion: Diagnostic radiology has experienced significant reimbursement cuts over the past decade, most severely among cross sectional modalities. This data further characterizes reimbursement trends for the field and suggests the need for sustainable future reimbursement schedules.
 - Example: Source Aunt Minnie March 29, 2024 article "How are radiology practices impacted by annual changes to the MPFS?"

o Physician shortages:

- Severe shortages in general and especially for radiologists is driving wages higher and recruiting expenses up.
- Attracting physicians to the upstate New York region is especially difficult.
- o Examples:
 - Women's Care Physician Practices dissolves and closes offices in Glens Falls and Saratoga on August 31, 2023.
 - Interventional Radiologist staffing coverage at Glens Falls Hospital, on-site and via on call, will change from 24/7 to only 7:30 Am to 5:00 Pm seven days a week effective July 1, 2024. This follows suit to other specialty practices, such Anesthesiology and Orthopedics, reducing hours of service coverage at GFH.

• Radiologist On-site Coverage Needs:

- Operating Radiology services requires direct physician supervision for many of the procedures performed per Medicare rules.
- O Building out the unfinished side of the Carey Road location provides an opportunity to close Advanced Imaging at Baybrook which has been in the same building for 20 years come next year.
- O Since Carey Road already has a radiologist on-site, this would reduce the need to staff one of the current six locations.
- As a result, it greatly improves radiologist employment recruitment by potentially attracting remote radiologist readers (Teleradiography). A radiologist workflow is completely digital and remote reading has grown tremendously in the past five years which has also increased the competition to recruit new physician employees.
- Adirondack Radiology Associates (ARA) recently hired its first Teleradiologist with a start date of July 1, 2024. ARA will need to hire more Teleradiogists in the future to sustain the practice.
- Closing Advanced Imaging at Baybrook is also good timing to take advantage of replacing the original Open MRI and a 11-year old PET/CT scanner with much improved digital technology including AI features (see other document).

• Carey Road Building Expenses:

- O The tenant 2 side of the building has been unfinished since the building open in October 2021 due to lack of an interested party and signed lease.
- O The triple net lease for tenant 1 side requires ARA to cover 100% of the Property and School taxes as well as the common area maintenance expenses without tenant 2 side occupied.
- The total charges for 2023 was \$175,355 which equates to \$12.07 psf. This is at the very high end of the market for this region.
- o The Property and School taxes accounts for \$61,778 or 35.2% of the total charges.
- o Sales Tax on the two new equipment purchase will be approximately \$164,500.
- o The tenant build-out cost is expected to be approximately \$850,000 which will require a loan.
- Closing the Baybrook location reduces duplicative expenses by approximately \$152,000 per year.
- With that said, this project is a huge financial burden and without assistance in the range of \$300,000 minimum and preferably \$350,000 this project may not be possible.

Project: Building Expansion for New Medical Imaging Technology

Project Location: Adirondack Radiology North Country 170 Carey Road Queensbury, NY 12804

Project Description:

The unfinished side of the Carey Road building will be completed and will offer new medical imaging technology to the residents of Warren and Washington counties. This newer technology will replace much older equipment. The two imaging scanners listed below will be the only one of their kind in the two counties.

Background:

Medical Imaging is an essential and invaluable service to diagnosing a multitude of patient conditions and diseases. Physicians and midlevel providers depend greatly upon these services to identify a root cause to a patient's complaints and symptoms which in turn leads to a patient care treatment plan. Imaging technology is also very useful in monitoring the effectiveness of the care plan and any reoccurrence of the disease.

The two pieces of equipment described below will be the only ones of their specific type in all of Warren and Washington counties.

New Medical Imaging Equipment:

1. Open MRI Scanner:

- Open MRI scanners serve a very useful purpose with claustrophobic patients. Many patients are unable to tolerate an MRI exam in the closed bore scanners which limits their options to an accurate diagnosis.
- New features of the Open MRI technology include the following. Faster Scan Times:
 - The current 20-year old Open MRI scanner requires approximately 45 minutes to complete an exam. This is a long time for a high anxiety patient to remain still or in some cases complete the exam. Thus, image motion is very common leading to poor image quality which potentially affects the accuracy of the diagnosis.
 - The new technology offers scan times as short as 15 minutes for a complete MRI exam.
 - The shorter scan times also expands scheduling capacity to handle more patients. MRI schedules are often backlogged 2 to 3 weeks out which delays patient diagnosis and care.

AI Image Acquisition & Reconstruction:

AI has become a critical new frontier for Imaging equipment. The AI technology helps to shorten the scan time and improves the image quality with better resolution allowing the Radiologist to see sharper details and detect even smaller lesions in a patient's body.

 Thus, AI is improving the accuracy of imaging reports and quality of care for patients.

2. PET/CT Scanner:

- Positron Emission Tomography (PET) combined with Computer Axial Tomography (CT or CAT Scan) is a dual scanner that fuses Nuclear Medicine images (PET) with x-ray images (CT). PET/CT exams are vital to diagnosing cancer and metastatic disease, radiation therapy planning, and the treatment response to chemotherapy. It is also rapidly growing in use with other areas discussed below.
- PET imaging is based on injecting a radioisotope into the patient's body. New isotopes are emerging and expanding the need for PET Imaging. The new PET scanner technology will be essential in the following growth areas.
 - Amyloid PET for Alzheimer's disease assessment emerging and effective treatments for Alzheimer's will increase the need for early detection. PET has been clinically proven to be one of the best imaging methods to identify amyloid protein changes to the brain.
 - Cardiac PET the FDA is close to approving a new F-18 radioisotope that would replace the need for a Rubidium generator which needs to be located at the imaging site. For this reason, Cardiac PET is very limited due to the extremely short half-life of Rubidium and the cost of housing a generator.
 - Theranostic Cancer Treatment Therapy new radioisotope tracers are now targeting cancer cells to diagnosis and deliver radiation treatment.
 - The above areas will require greater patient access to PET scans and the new technology discussed below will be required to handle the volume growth.
- New features of the PET/CT technology include the following. Digital Detectors:
 - The current PET/CT unit is 11-years old and operates as an analog scanner.
 The digital technology has many benefits which facilities the improvement listed below.

Faster Scan Times:

- Many of the same advantages listed for the Open MRI scanner are also applicable with the PET technology.
- PET/CT scanners are more expensive to purchase than most MRI units and thus there is even less patient access and availability to PET exams.

AI Image Acquisition & Reconstruction:

O The same AI benefits are also applicable with the PET scanner. Maybe even more so since PET images in general lack definition and resolution compared to other imaging modalities due to the image capture process. AI software and digital detectors has transformed the image quality to a completely new level.
